



PUBLIC NOTICE REGULARISATION OF OVERSTAYED FOREIGN REGISTERED VEHICLES IMPORTED UNDER TEMPORARY IMPORT PERMIT FOR VISITORS' VEHICLES (TIP)

The Zimbabwe Revenue Authority (ZIMRA) is hereby reminding the public, and other entities who may be in possession of vehicles which were imported into Zimbabwe under Temporary Import Permit (TIP) for visitor's vehicle that it is an offence to keep these vehicles in Zimbabwe when the TIP has expired.

It is noted that a number of these vehicles which are in Zimbabwe, at inland cities and towns, and in other areas like Chipinge, Tsholotsho, Gokwe, Guruve, to name but a few.

Some of the circumstances leading to expiry of TIPs have been the following:

- Vehicle broken down and yet to be repaired,
- Vehicle involved in an accident, and is still to be transported out of the country,
- · Vehicle involved in an accident, and is now a wreck,
- Vehicle was abandoned, with owner having departed from Zimbabwe,
- Visitor who brought the vehicle is still in Zimbabwe, but the TIP has expired.

Persons in possession of vehicles with circumstances described above are advised to contact their nearest ZIMRA Office, or write to the email addresses listed below by not later than **30 September 2024,** to regularise the stay of their vehicle, or to export it from Zimbabwe.

Please note that this moratorium ends on **30 September 2024**, and any vehicle whose TIP status has not been regularized will be treated as liable for seizure and possible forfeiture in terms of the Customs and Excise Act, Chapter 23:02.
